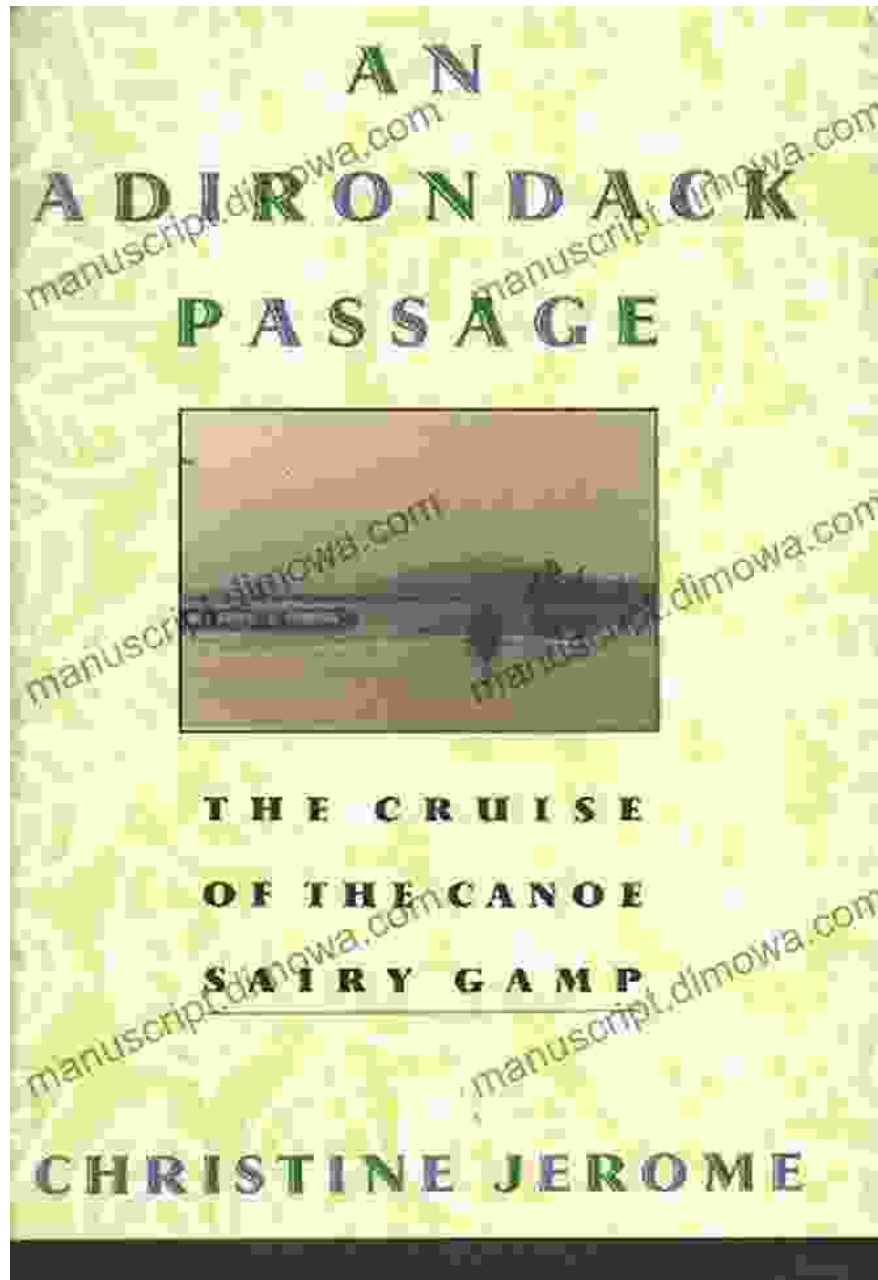
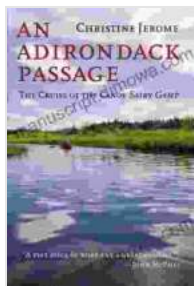

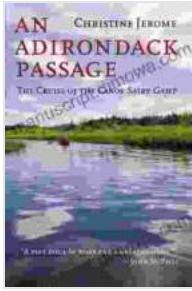
About the Author: Frederick Niven

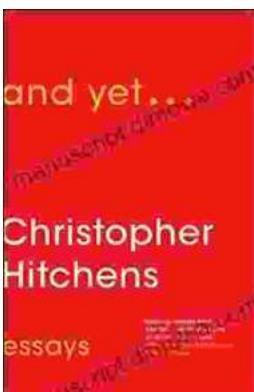
