
Robert Lee Pettit Jr.: The Life and Career of a Basketball Legend

After graduating from high school, Pettit attended Louisiana State University (LSU). He played varsity basketball for the LSU Tigers for three seasons and helped lead the team to two Southeastern Conference (SEC) championships. Pettit was named the SEC Player of the Year in 1954 and was a consensus All-American in 1955.

In 1954, Pettit was selected by the St. Louis Hawks with the second overall pick in the NBA draft. He quickly became one of the top players in the



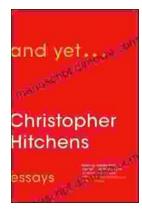
